RELIGIOUS ACTIVITIES

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ACCREDITATION

CAAST has used the Griggs International Academy (GIA) curriculum, which is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) Commissions on Elementary, Middle, and Secondary Schools, and Middle States Association (MSA) Commission on Elementary Schools. The GIA is also accredited by the commission on International and Trans-Regional Accreditation (CITA), the Accrediting Commission of the Distance Education and Training Council (DETC) and the Accrediting Association of Seventh-day Adventist Schools, Colleges and Universities. GIA is approved by the Maryland State Department of Education for the Kindergarten, Elementary, and High School.

After 7 years of using the GIA curriculum, CAAST then independently used the same text books as GIA. If and when an accredited official transcript was needed, we contracted with North American Regional High School (NARHS), from which the transcript would have been issued after the required fee of \$400 per year reflected on transcript is paid.

CAAST currently uses the guidelines of Christian Light Education to teach our students English, Reading, Computer Basics, and Mathematics courses. All other courses are taught from the text books from varied Home School curriculums and highly recommended high school text books. Bible is taught using the Bible as the main source with other texts as references.

STATEMENT OF PHILOSOPHY

To train boys and girls from varied cultures and backgrounds, introduce them to God and His love, mold them with God's principles ("they shall be taught of God." John 6:45), which are enveloped in educational programs that "build a foundation for service to God, church and society." (Griggs International Academy).

HISTORY

Ellsworth Cross wrote the following. This will give you an idea of how it all began.

Oshkosh, Esther, Such A Time As This 2009

This past summer more than forty thousand members of households from all across the globe gathered on Oshkosh, Wisconsin for the 'Courage To Stand' event now affectionately referred to as CTS by Pathfinders all around the world.

When the Youth Director, Pastor Black, made the charge on Sabbath morning to the largest gathering I have ever had the privilege to be a part of, he challenged us to return to our communities with the courage to stand. The nightly meetings during the Pathfinder

By the grace of God, when school starts on August 30, 2010, it is my desire that the names you have documented will be the individuals responsible for the formation of the new high school: Christian Academy of Arts, Science and Technology (CAAST).

I can hear the noise of questioning minds, amid the joy of curious parents and chatter of impatient eighth graders.

- Where is this new school?
- Who are the teachers?
- Will they have sports?
- What colleges will accept?
- Can we afford this?
- Plain clothes or uniforms?
- Only for Adventists?
- Is it accredited?

The success of this proposed school may depend on the answers. However, it is only as we remember the way God has led us in the past, and as we ask for the 'courage to stand' at 'such a time as this', will we overcome the fear of failure and the possibility of defeat.

The first day of school: August 30, 2010, at the Connecticut Valley Adventist Church (CVAC) school house, located at 354 Foster Road, South Windsor, CT 06074.

ADMISSION

Christian Academy of Arts, Science and Technology (CAAST), owned and operated by Seventh-day Adventists (SDA), is primarily for the training of boys and girls who are willing to be trained and then live by the principles of the SDA church. Accepting admission to CAAST, parents and students understand that each one pledges to uphold the standards as the philosophy and principle of the church and school.

Application Procedure

To be considered for admission to CAAST, all the following forms must be completed and signed by the student and parent as required.

- 1) Application form
- 2) Emergency Treatment Consent Form
- 3) Medical Records Form
- 4) Official transcript from most recent school *
- 5) Graduation certificate from grade 8 if starting at CAAST in grade 9 *
- 6) Financial intent form
- 7) Use of Computer and Internet Form
- 8) Permission to Photograph Form
- Home Schooled students may be exempt.

CAAST will admit students of any race, color, national or ethnic origin to all offered courses and activities. CAAST does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, gender, or social standing. All students, once accepted, agree to uphold the standards of the SDA teachings and CAAST policies.

All documents will be retained by CAAST indefinitely.

Directory information may be freely shared with other SDA institutions.

ACADEMIC INFORMATION

For details of the courses offered at CAAST, see the most recent copy of the Catalog of Courses.

If requested, CAAST will issue official transcripts to all students.

LATE REGISTRAION Students wishing to attend CAAST after the start of the school year will be billed based on the number of months left in the year. Academics will be determined by the Academic Staff.

WITHDRAWAL Withdrawal from school before the end of the school year will be allowed upon the completion of the 'Withdrawal Form'. This form is to be competed and signed by the student and parent(s).

REFUNDS. Students wishing to withdraw from CAAST before the end of the school year will be eligible for a refund, only if the full amount was paid for the entire year. The amount will be at the discretion of the school board.

Those paying on a monthly basis are <u>not</u> eligible for a refund. Students who are suspended or expelled are <u>not</u> eligible for a refund.

ATTENDANCE POLICY

School will be in session for 150 to 180 days, from August/September to June. Students are required to be in school for each of those days. If a child is absent, the parent is required to let the form teacher know. If the child is absent, and the form teacher has not heard from the parent, a call will be made to the parent to enquire of the student's location/status.

<u>Punctuality</u> is also very important. While timeliness does not affect the student's grade point average (GPA), each student will be encouraged to be on-time. If late and missed worship, the student will be responsible to review the information shared in worship and produce a written report before the end of the current school day.

<u>Worship</u> starts at 8am. Every student must attend the worship session. If on campus and not in attendance to worship, the student will be responsible to review the information shared in worship and produce a written report before the end of the current school day.

<u>Classes begin</u> at 8:30am Monday through Thursday and end at 3:30pm. No classes on Fridays. Instead, students are encouraged to serve their community. A total of 20 documented <u>Community Service Hours</u> should be completed each school year.

School recognized holidays and vacations are detailed on the school's calendar.

<u>If a student is sick</u> for 3 or more days, a completed and signed 'Absence Report Form' must be submitted to the form teacher.

If <u>inclement weather</u> causes poor road conditions, notification of late openings and/or closures will be sent via text messages and/or posted on WFSB (channel 3) or WTNH (channel 8).

It is very important that students do not remain on the campus after school hours, nor come to school earlier than 7:30am, unless supervised by a member of staff. The liability insurance covers students only during school and under supervision of an authorized person. For this reason, and for safety issues, all students must leave the campus on-time. Should there be an emergency, and the designated person is unable to pick up the child, the parent or designated driver needs to notify the principal or teacher of the adjusted plan.

TRANSPORTATION

<u>Parents are primarily responsible</u> for getting their children to school.

<u>Students may drive their cars to school</u>. The parent(s) would then need to complete and sign a form, which details the use of the car during school hours.

<u>Students may ride their bicycles to school</u>, providing the roads have proper side-walks and/or pedestrian accessible areas allowing for the bicycles.

<u>Students may walk to school</u>, providing the roads have proper side-walks and/or pedestrian accessible areas.

<u>CAAST provides bus transportation</u> for all students in need of help getting to school. The daily bus route will be determined based on the home addresses of the students. The bus will not travel from home to home, but there will be a central pick-up location.

CAMPUS CONDUCT

- 1. Students are expected to respect each other and each other's property.
- 2. School property must be cared for.
- 3. There shall be no eating, nor drinking during class-times.
- 4. Students are expected to be completely uniformed while attending CAAST.
- 5. Students are free to walk, relax, sit around the campus ground except for the outlined restricted areas. Signs are posted.
- 6. Chewing of gum is prohibited during class-time (including PE), worship-time, and meetings.

SCHOOL ATTIRE

- Shirts or blouses: black, red, or white, long or short sleeve, with CAAST logo on left breast
- Pants or skirts: black or khaki. PANTS should be properly fitted, not sagging on the hips. No tight pants. SKIRTS are to be knee length, both when standing and sitting. No tight skirts.
- Shoes: black and low heels, nothing above 2 inches
- Socks: black or white with khaki skirts
- Nylon stockings or tights under skirt: skin tone or black or white with khaki
- Sweaters or Sweater Vests with CAAST logo
- White lab coats (long or short sleeve)
- T-shirts: red with CAAST logo
- Sweat suits: Light grey, red, black, or white with CAAST logo
- NO jewelry
- NO fake finger nails nor eye lashes
- NO make-up nor nail polish

FIRE DRILLS/LOCK DOWNS/REVERSE FIRE DRILLS

All personnel - students, teachers, administrative staff, grounds staff, and bus drivers - must be familiar to all exit signs and locations. Fire drills/Lock Downs/ Reverse Fire Drills will be performed at least once per month. The School Principal determines the dates.

DRUGS

Abuse, misuse, and sale of drugs are strictly prohibited at CAAST. The administrative body reserves the right to have drug testing done on anyone suspected misusing or abusing any drug. If found guilty, the student will either be suspended or expelled.

UNACCEPTABLE ACTIVITIES

Anyone found guilty of the following activities, will be expelled from CAAST, or at least be suspended by the Disciplinary Board.

- 1. Insubordination of any staff or faculty member.
- 2. Undermining the faith or religious ideals of the Seventh-day Adventist Church.
- 3. Use of indecent or profane language.
- 4. Viewing, displaying, sharing or possession of
 - (a) Pornographic pictures
 - (b) Obscene pictures
 - (c) Occult games
 - (d) Occult materials
- 5. The use or possession of explosives, firearms, weapons, which include, but not limited to pellet guns, knives, fireworks.
- 6. Willful destruction of school property.
- 7. Tampering with the security, fire alarm, internet or telephone system(s)
- 8. Breaking in and entering school facilities
- 9. Participation in or conspiracy to perform activities which may degrade, disgrace, or injure any other student or staff member.
- 10. Dishonesty.
- 11. Gambling.
- 12. Inappropriate sexual conduct.
- Use, possession, handing of alcoholic beverages, narcotics, tobacco, and/or drug paraphernalia.
- 14. Go beyond campus limits or to leave the campus without permission from a faculty/staff member.

The legal authorities (police) will be notified of anyone found guilty of

- (a) Possession and/or distribution of illegal drugs
- (b) Possession and/or distribution of firearms and weapons
- (c) Expressing a threat to someone's life.

CAAST reserves the right to question a student and to search a student's bag, locker, vehicle and person without the student's or parents' consent. Each student will be charged for any necessary drug testing.

<u>Harassment</u> in any form is prohibited at CAAST. Anyone, staff/faculty member, or student found guilty of harassment, will be in jeopardy of being asked to leave CAAST.

Anyone experiencing harassment should feel comfortable to report the incident to the School Principal, a teacher, the School Chaplin. All cases will be treated confidentially - as deemed appropriate.

LOCKERS

Each student will be assigned a locker and a combination lock. No student will be allowed to use their own lock. No lock with keys will be used.

LOST ARTICLES

CAAST is not responsible for any personal item. Any found item must be taken to the administrative office. This item will be placed in the lost-and-found area.

TOILETRIES

In order to help keep the cost of school operation down, all students and staff members are asked, at the <u>start of each semester</u>, to take for daily use: 2 boxes of facial tissue, 2 packs of at least 100-count napkins, 3 bottles of hand soap, 4 rolls of paper towels, 6 rolls of toilet paper, 1 container of sanitary wipes.

These items will be placed in storage and used as needed while school is in session.

FACULTY AND STAFF

Christian Academy of Arts, Science and Technology (CAAST) employs only men and women of exceptional quality - men and women who are active members of the Seventh-day Adventist Church, and who have a mission mind-set to win souls for the Kingdom of Heaven, enveloping the fact that boys and girls are to be prepared for this life on earth.

PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT is essential to each child's growth and development, so make it your duty to get to know your child's teacher. Make sure that you are a member of the Parent-Teachers Association (PTA).

Other ORGANIZATIONS

School Choir, School Band, Orchestra, Drama Club. Others may be developed.

SCIENCE... the sciences will be taught: Chemistry, Biology, Physics, Earth Science, Mathematics, Agricultural Science, and Computer Science.

MEALS

Each student is responsible for providing his/her own lunch and/or other snack, as needed for the school day. No meat, no fish, no alcoholic beverages are allowed on the school campus. All students are encouraged to eat healthily, low salt, low sugar meals and at least 8 cups of water per day. Daily fruits and vegetables are highly encouraged.

HEALTH SERVICES

There is a staff nurse* available to students during school sessions. The school nurse s responsible for all health records, providing emergency services for injury or illness, and for helping to prevent and control diseases.

Any daily regular medications must be documented and kept by the school nurse. Students must see the school nurse for the administration of these medications. All medications must be accompanied by a copy of a current prescription. Non-prescription (over-the-counter...OTC) medications may be available from the school nurse. All incidences of administration will be documented by the school nurse.

*If the school nurse is not available on campus, there will be a trained person assigned to do these tasks.

CAAST has a medical doctor of record, who is available to ensure that all medical records are kept and properly maintained.

SPORTS

CAAST does not participate in interscholastic sports. Students are required to participate in sports during Physical Exercise (PE) classes, and encouraged to be involved in after school sporting activities.

EXERCISE

Daily exercise of 30 minutes outside (if the temperature is 30 degrees Fahrenheit or higher) is a requirement. This allows for fresh air, sunlight, and increased activity of the heart.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION

PLEASE NOTE: Dollar amounts may be adjusted each academic year.

Christian Academy of Arts, Science and Technology (CAAST) is determined to educate boys and girls as economically as is possible. CAAST is a non-profit organization, and all funds are therefore used only to give to students the best that is available, with God's grace.

It has been determined that an annual fee of \$7,000 (grades 9 to 12) or \$4,000 (grades 7 and 8) is needed from each student to ensure that CAAST is fully operational. This dollar amount includes all fees: application, lab, local transportation, clubs, bands, orchestra, text books, library, graduation, and tuition.

<u>This dollar amount does not include</u> charges for field trips, daily transportation to and from school, uniforms (school, choir, band, etc.), lab coats, any stationary (paper, pens, pencils markers, highlighters, crayons, paint, etc), private music lessons, and music instrument rental.

At CAAST, we are sensitive to the financial status of all families. For that reason, the tuition has been reduced to \$3,000 (grades 9 to 12) or \$2,000 (grades 7 and 8).

To buffer this reduction, everyone is encouraged to participate in all **fundraising activities**. This is, however, a choice. If the choice is made not to participate, then the original tuition (\$7000 or \$4000) will be billed.

Registration fee: \$50 per student.

PERSONAL COMMUNICATION DEVICES (PCDs)

PCDs include, but are not limited to, black berries, cell phones, laptops, i-phones, i-pods, head-phones, etc. CAAST allows students to use their PCDs, respecting all persons at all times. PCD's are NOT allowed:

- 1) During class-times
- 2) During chapel/worship times
- 3) During meetings
- 4) During PE
- 5) During field trips, unless permitted by the supervisor.

COMPUTER USE

Each student is required to sign a 'Use of Computer and Internet Form'.

No student may use any computer, unless properly supervised by the teacher in charge.

Students are expected to properly care for each of the computers belonging to CAAST. Abuse, misuse, changing of software and/or hardware will NOT be tolerated, and will be grounds for suspension of computer use, or even suspension from classes.

PLAGIARISM is illegal, and in no way will be tolerated.

WORK STUDY PROGRAMS

CAAST is affiliated with local businesses, who have agreed to have CAAST students work voluntarily within their facility. This will allow for the students to gain experience in the work world and for the positive net-working process to begin for their career paths. The days and times for these work experiences, will be determined on an individual basis.
